Biographical/Historical note: Elias Ball Bull was an author, historian, and researcher with the Charleston County Planning Board.

Scope and content: Personal papers mainly consist of clippings, correspondence, employment records, and writings (poetry and short prose), as well as papers pertaining to Bull's interest and work in historic preservation and his association with various organizations including the South Carolina Archaeological Society, the Confederate Home, the Piping and Marching Society, Poetry Society of South Carolina, Society of the Bull Family of Ashley Hall, Summerville Preservation Society, the Unitarian Church, and the Young Democrats.

Genealogical research focuses on the Ball and Bull families and related lines including those of Izard, Rees (Rhys), Shand, Wilson and Wright. Bull's family history contains data on Acton House, and autobiographical notes by Rev. Robert Wilson (1838-1924) including his attestations about the burning of Columbia (S.C.) in 1865.

Historical research covers a wide variety of subjects relating to Charleston (S.C.) and the surrounding Lowcountry area, principally Berkeley and Dorchester counties. Subjects include Cainhoy, Chicora (or New England Town, an extinct town), Childsbury, Daniel Island, Pineville, a study of poor white farmers in Berkeley County who lost their land in 1880, Charleston architecture and history, local folk art, folk music, a Quaker cemetery in Charleston, Bull's Island, Magnolia Cemetery, Morris Island, Mount Pleasant, Rockville, Willtown, Jedburg, churches and meeting houses, church campgrounds, the Unitarian Church, forts and fortifications in the Charleston area, Martello towers, Santee delta storm towers, mills, trees, plantations, the Santee Canal and Christian Senf, and various individuals and families including William Turpin, Culcheth Golightly, William T. White (a Charleston stonecutter), Nathaniel Williams (a free person of color), and the Grimke family. Other research consists of citations to references in various newspapers dating from the mid 18th century to the early 19th century including the Carolina Gazette, Mercury, Charleston Courier, South Carolina Gazette and Country Journal, South Carolina Gazette, Charleston Herald, Gazette of the State of South Carolina, and the Charleston Morning Post. Topics include the Bull family, clubs, crime, inventors and inventions of South Carolina, schools, the Santee Canal, natural disasters, ships, the Turpin family, transportation, and the South Carolina Militia (arranged by names of units). Two card files index the names of criminals appearing in the S.C. Gazette, and the names of inventors (1670-1865).
