Biographical/historical note: Edward McCrady (1802-1892) was a Charleston, S.C. attorney, theologian, and South Carolina state Representative.

Scope and content: Papers consist of correspondence, financial and legal records, estate records, wills, journals, writings, genealogical material, and other items. Included are the papers of John Anthony DeBerniere (ca. 1744-1812) and James M. Shackelford (1810-1878), and McCrady family papers.

Correspondence (1832-1891) of Edward McCrady (1802-1892) concerns the religious instruction of slaves, Episcopal Church affairs (including racial issues), missionary work with Muslims, legal matters, politics and elections, secession, the Civil War defenses of Charleston (S.C.), William H. Trescot's political career, family and personal matters, the relation of science and religion, and other matters. Correspondents include J.W. Miles, William H. Trescot, Edward McCrady, Jr., Louis Agassiz, and many others.

Writings (1844-1877) include manuscripts and printed pamphlets authored by Edward McCrady. There are also other printed materials concerning South Carolina Episcopal Diocese Conventions (ca. 1869-1880's) and Episcopal Church affairs, as well as notes, letters, and other items. Receipts (1834-1887) are for taxes, groceries, subscriptions, donations, and other expenses.

Legal case papers (1800-1901) are arranged alphabetically by client name and concern estate matters, property litigation, bankruptcies, and many other court cases and legal services. One group of documents consists of the family and estate papers (1787-1884) of members of the Johnson family, including U.S. Supreme Court Justice William Johnson and his wife, children, brothers, and cousins. These include correspondence, property records, powers of attorney, a will, and other items. Other legal documents include wills (1823-1874) of McCrady's legal clients (including Hagar Johnson, a free woman of color), marriage settlements, opinions, briefs, decrees, agreements, and related correspondence.

Legal journals (1841-1886), many indexed, contain daily notes on conferences with clients or other lawyers, court cases, correspondence, and personal matters, and include some personal cash accounts.

Genealogical material (1890-ca. 1965) includes notes, writings, and correspondence concerning various related families including the McCrady, DeBerniere, Shackelford, Ford, Taylor, Hooper, and Franklin families.

Personal correspondence, 1832-1859. (49 items).

Charleston lawyer. Personal correspondence (1832-1859) of Edward McCrary, Sr. Correspondents include William McDougall, Judge Jams M. Wayne, Arthur Wigfall regarding religious instruction of slaves (1846), William H. Trescot regarding business matters and the French government (1848), Christopher C. Memminger, William Aiken, and others regarding legal affairs, Episcopal Church matters, the death of Edward McCrary, Sr.'s mother (1845), the female seminary in Rapides, Lousiana (1850), fire insurance (1852), and other matters. Also a resolution of the Syrian Mission Committee, Charleston (1848) and a letter from James Warley Miles (1818-1875), missionary in Persia, regarding work with Muslim people and life as a missionary. The first folder contains a letter and job proposal regarding the hiring of private school teachers discussing salary and qualifications (1841).

Charleston lawyer. Mostly letters (October 1860 – April 1861) of William H. Trescot in Washington, D.C. and Barnwell Island near Beaufort, to his uncle Edward McCrary, Sr. regarding the election of 1860, Lincoln's election, the Buchannan Administration, the legality and strategy of secession, election results (November 1861), personalities in Washington, D.C. during the secession crisis including Howell Cobb, Lewis Cass, and President James Buchannan; description of military situation in Charleston and of Major Robert Anderson; South Carolina secession convention, South Carolina commissioners to Washington, D.C.; recount of conversation with President Buchannan (November 27, 1860); overview of William H. Trescot's diplomatic and cabinet career in Washington, D.C. and lament over the loss of his governmental career; the mood and government strategy in Washington, D.C. for South Carolina officials; the Montgomery Convention (April 1861); and many other matters. Also letters of J.J. Hooper to Edward McCrary, Sr. regarding John McCrary's application to the Confederate Engineering Corps (1861); James R. Robinson, Columbia, regarding counterfeit bills and A. Mazyck regarding Confederate taxes (1863). Chronologically arranged.

Charleston lawyer. Personal and religious correspondence (1864-1891) of Edward McCrary, Sr. Much of the material is regarding legal, political, health, family matters, Protestant Episcopal Convention matters, St. Philip's Church, and a great deal on race issues in the Episcopal Church. Includes debates on whether to include or exclude Charleston's St. Mark's Episcopal Church (African American) into the Episcopal Diocese and National Conventions (1870s).

Correspondents include C.P. Gadsden regarding political and religious consequences of being conquered (1865); George R. Fairbanks regarding the University of the South (1867); Thomas W. Glover regarding his judicial nomination (1867); John D. McCollough of Spartanburg; Daniel Ravenel, John Johnson including a letter (1864) regarding Johnson's service at Ft. Sumter; Thomas F. Davis of Camden, J.J. Pringle Smith, Bishop W.B.W. Howe, Louis deBerniere McCrary, Ellison Capers from Greenville and Selma, Alabama; George Trescot, A. Toomer Porter regarding the broken engagement of Rev. Trapier with a denial that the fiancée used opium (May 19, 1876); Peter J. Shand, William H. Trescot regarding judgeship of William J. Whipper, one of the first elected African American officials in South Carolina (1876); McMillan & Co., Christopher G. Memminger, Albert T. McNeal, Edward McCrary, Jr. regarding legal, political, personal, and a visit (August 26, 1870) to Hot Springs, Virginia with a description of a visit with Robert E. Lee; and John McCrary. Correspondence of John McCrary (1865, 1873-1881) includes a letter to Lewis Gibbes regarding the College of Charleston (1865); letters from Louis Agassiz (1873); and many letters to Edward McCrary, Sr. to John McCrary from Cambridge, Massachusetts and Sewanee, Tennessee regarding the connection between religion and science, academics, public lectures, the funeral of Louis Agassiz, news of Alexander Aggasiz; a letter of Charles W. Eliot regarding John McCrary's election as a professor at Harvard (1874); John McCrary's resignation from Harvard (1877) with mention of Professor William James; family and health matters; letters of John McCrary to A. Toomer Porter and Judge Kershaw regarding political and religious matters; a yellow fever scare in Tennessee (1878); financial disputes with Telfair Hodgsen of Sewanee Tennessee; Edward McCrary, Sr.'s commencement address (1879) at the University of the South; John McCrary's patent for ink (1880); lectures at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore, Maryland (1880); H.A.M. Smith's letters regarding John McCrary's last illness and condolence letter to Edward McCrary, Sr. after the death of John McCrary. Chronologically arranged.

St. Philip's Episcopal Church vestryman. Writings, notes, pamphlets, printed matter, letters and other materials regarding Edward McCrary, Sr.'s role as vestryman of St. Philip's and as a delegate to the Episcopal Diocese Convention (ca. 1869-1880s). Included are writings and notes regarding the entrance of black delegates from Charleston's St. Mark's Episcopal Church to the Episcopal Diocese Convention; material regarding Sullivans Island's Grace Church and many notes on various Diocese issues. Also includes a record of religious service (1870-1873) with notations of marriages, baptisms, and funerals at various churches in the lowcountry. Pamphlets

and printed matter include “Report on the Application of St. Mark’s Church (colored) to be Admitted in Union with this Convention” (1876); “Report on Admission of St. Mark’s”; “Apology at St. Philip’s Church” (ca. 1870); “Change in the Litany” (1880); and other printed matter with copies of the “Monthly Record, Diocese of South Carolina” (1871-1873).
