Biographical/Historical Note: Educator and historian. Professor William H. Pease and his wife Jane H. Pease authored "The Web of Progress: Private Values and Public Styles in Boston and Charleston, 1828-1843," a comparative study of the culture and economy of Boston, Mass., and Charleston, S.C. The book was published in 1985.

Scope and content: Research material for the book "The Web of Progress" chiefly consists of a biographical file (4x6 index cards) of white Charlestonians, each card listing at least a name and often additional information including address, occupation, and church and organizational affiliations; and a chronologically arranged file of notes on various aspects of the culture, politics, and economics of Charleston (S.C.) taken from primary contemporary sources such as newspapers, minutes of organizations, manuscripts, and public documents (bulk ca. 1820-1844).

In addition, there are computer printouts of statistical analyses of the research data, and a code book (key) for the coding used in these.
