Biographical/Historical note: Elias Ball Bull was an author, historian, and researcher with the

Charleston County Planning Board.

Scope and content: Collection consists of visual materials removed from the Elias Ball Bull Papers, and from papers of Nan S. Ball and Mary W. Ball. Visual materials from the Elias Ball Bull Papers includes a series of photographs of historic buildings in Charleston, S.C., taken by Charles N. Bayless; Elias Ball Bull's photographs and negatives of historic sites and buildings in the tri-county area (1970s), including locales in Rockville, Christ Church Parish, and Berkeley County, and Fort Pemberton, and Batteries Thomson and Gadsden; and strips of negatives, in groups designated as volumes, with lists of subjects, include locales in Rockville, Christ Church Parish, and Berkeley County. Other subjects include Lawton Bluff, Secessionville, Stallsville, Magnolia Cemetery, Loch Dhu, Lawson's Pond, Harietta Plantation, Comingtee, Peachtree Plantation, John's Island Presbyterian Church, 56 Bull Street, Old Bethel Methodist Church, Pineville, the Grove Plantation (St. Paul's Parish), Central Baptist Church (Charleston), old Lincolnville Town Hall, Highway 61 Historical District, Magnolia Cemetery, Cathedral of St. Luke and St. Paul, the Santee Canal, and Chisolm's Mill. Visual materials from the papers of Nan S. Ball and Mary W. Ball include family photographs (and negatives), loose and in albums, depicting various groups and scenes in North Carolina and on Ball family plantations, as well as a color miniature painting of Rev. Robert Wilson (ca. 1920?) painted by Jean Robinson Fleming.

- Album titled "My Friends" containing autographs, mementos, and miniature portrait photographs, and a miniature photo of a wedding party. Also, a disbound album (ca. 1900) titled "Kodagraphs" (and inscribed N.S.B.) containing photographs of Limerick Plantation, Kensington Plantation, Wadboo Bridge, Quinby Plantation, Comingtee Plantation, Strawberry Chapel, a post office in Cordesville, and Pompion Hill chapel, as well as photos of Ball family members.
