Visual Materials from the Porcher Family Papers, 1870-1930 SCHS# 1082.00 VM

Description: 0.5 linear feet (2 boxes)

Scope and Content: Collection consists of visual materials removed from the Porcher Family Papers (SCHS# 1082.00), consisting mainly of photographs of Porcher family members and related families. They include images of Hezekiah Maham, a portrait of Peter Porcher, Francis Peyre Porcher, Daisie Porcher, Leigh family members, and an African American chimney sweep. There are also images of scenes at Walworth Plantation, Eutaw Plantation, and Fairspring Plantation; Rock Hill (or Connemara) in Flat Rock, North Carolina; and the gravestone of Elizabeth Catherine Ravenel.

Folders in Box 1 are arranged by original VM inventory numbers. Folders in Box 2 are arranged by their original box and folder numbers in the manuscript collection.

Includes a reprint of a photograph of Francis Peyre Porcher; cabinet photographs of men identified as Bentley Hasell, Benjamin Watkins Leigh, William Roach, Jr., and Luther Galloway; photographs of Breckinridge Long, Judge Ashby Wickam, and Thomas P. Inabinet; and a tintype of an unidentified boy.
- 2002.110-02 Photographs of women (mostly unidentified), ca. 1850-1939. Includes cdvs of women identified as Helen Allston and Anne Porcher; cabinet photographs of Miss Ada B. Winnie, and Elizabeth Sinkler Porcher (Mrs. John Roberts); and a portrait photograph of Maria L. Porcher.
- 2002.110-03 Photographs of children (mostly unidentified), ca. 1880-1985. Includes photographs of children identified as Bessie Lesesne [Fraser] and William Galloway.

- 2002.110-04 Photographs of groups of people (mostly unidentified), ca. 1880-ca. 1960.
- 2002.110-05 Photographs of classes and school children (mostly unidentified), 1927-ca.1950, one of which is labelled "Adult Opportunity School, Summer 1927."

- 11/321/02 Photograph and negative of a portrait of Hezekiah Maham; and a photograph of his gravestone.
- 11/321/06 Mostly family photographs, ca. 1870-ca. 1910. Includes images of a portrait painting of "Peter Porcher of Oakfield, 1764-1807"; a tintype of an unidentified woman; Daisy (or Daisy) Porcher; a cdv of Robert E. Lee; B. W. Leigh; Dr. T. Gaillard Thomas; members of the Tucker family; Bishop Bratton (Theodore DuBose Bratton); people at the Yerba Buena Ranch; Francis Peyre Porcher; and Margaret W. Porcher.
- 11/321/07 Mostly family photographs, ca. 1870-ca. 1930. Includes images of members of the Leigh family and Porcher family, Elizabeth L. Porcher, Miss Maria L. Porcher, Charles Stevens Porcher, Charlotte M. Stoney, Daisy Porcher, and the "Davis Porchers, El Paso Texas."
- 11/321/08 Photographs of places and people. Includes photographs of portrait paintings of Major Samuel Porcher, Thomas William Porcher, Henrietta Gourdin ("Mrs. James Gaillard"), Ellinor Cordes Porcher (1810-1888), and an unidentified man. There are also images of an African American woman, a maid named Betty; scenes at Walworth Plantation, the gravestone of Elizabeth Catherine Ravenel, Rock Hill (or Connemara, Flat Rock, N.C.), Eutaw Plantation (Orangeburg County), Fairspring (or Fair Spring) Plantation (Berkeley County), and Rock Hall, a house in Arden, North Carolina. One photograph depicts an African American chimney sweep, a boy named "Roarer."
