**Scope and Content:** The South Carolina Historical Society Stereograph Collection consists of 19<sup>th</sup> century stereographic photographs, most of which depict historic buildings, including churches and plantation houses, as well as gardens, cemeteries, and military sites in South Carolina. Groups within this collection contain many images of fortifications and scenes mainly relating to the Civil War in Charleston, including views of Fort Sumter and Fort Moultrie, and batteries on Morris Island. Frequent subjects of the stereographs include Magnolia Gardens and Magnolia Cemetery.
