



**Louisa S. McCord family papers, 1786-1954**

**Creator:** McCord, Louisa S.

**Description:** 0.5 linear ft.

**Scope and Content:** South Carolina author. In 1840 she married attorney David James McCord. She was the daughter of Langdon Cheves (1776-1857), a South Carolina plantation owner, judge, financier, and politician. Her mother was Mary Elizabeth Dulles, daughter of Sophia Heatly and Joseph Dulles, a Charleston, S.C. merchant who later resided in Philadelphia (Pa.). Joseph Heatly Dulles (1795-1876) of Philadelphia, Pa. was the brother of Mary Elizabeth Dulles Cheves and the father of Anna Welsh Dulles (1822-1906), who married Charles Janeway Stille. Papers consist of correspondence, estate records, and other items. Included are the papers (1851-1880) of Louisa Susanna Cheves McCord; McCord family papers (1829-1954); papers (1786-1854) of Ann Heatly Lovell (d. 1834); and correspondence (1838-1858) of Anna Welsh Dulles Stille.

Correspondence (1838-1858) of Anna W. Dulles (later Anna Stille) mainly consist of letters to her in Philadelphia (Pa.) and St. Matthew's Parish (S.C.) from relatives and friends in St. Matthew's Parish (S.C.), Columbia (S.C.), Charleston (S.C.), and elsewhere. Letters concern family and social affairs, friends and acquaintances, social life in Totness (Calhoun County, S.C.), and other matters. Correspondents include "Annie" (Anne) E. Miles, "Bet" (Mary Elizabeth) Hampton, Anna Maria Cheves Huger, and members of the McCord family.

St. Matthews Planter. Letters to Ann Heally Reid Lovell from her husband, James Lovell, regarding financial, plantation and family matters including 1826 marital separation plans. Also letters from Mary E. Cheves, Alexander Cheves, Mary E. McCord, Joseph H. Dulles, and other nieces and nephews, the factors Cheeseborough and Campbell regarding family matters, plantation affairs, the furniture of Langdon Cheves, and other matters. Estate papers of Ann Heally Reid Lovell, Joseph Dulles, Langdon Cheves and Sophia Dulles. Also typescript of many letters and accounts of Ann Heally Reid Lovell.

**Letters, 1838-1858. Approx 33 letters**

Niece of Langdon Cheves from Philadelphia. Letters from Anna Dulles Stille from relatives and friends in St. Matthews, Columbia, and Charleston including Anna Cheves (Huger), Mary E. Hampton (McCord) with some of Mary E. Hampton's letters to her adopted mother M.E. Richardson, Ann E. Miles, and others regarding Cheves family; personal and family matters with some mention of politics.

**Papers, 1851-1880. Approx 40 items**

Daughter of Langdon Cheves. Letters to Louisa McCord from Columbia and Langsyne Plantation, Fort Motte, to Mary Dulles and others regarding family matters and public affairs. Letters (1878) and notes regarding bust of Langdon Cheves with Preston Powers. Louisa McCord estate papers and much biographical information.

Columbia family. Receipts, letters, notes of David McCord regarding politics, religion with biographical notes.
