Biographical/Historical Note: Miss Richardson served as assistant to the director of the Charleston Museum (Charleston, S.C.) for 39 years. Her writings include "Dr. Anthony Cordes and Some of his Descendants."

Scope and Content: Papers chiefly consist of genealogical material compiled by Emma B. Richardson pertaining to many South Carolina families including the families of Bentham, Boylston, Bruneau, Buchanan, Buford, Cartwright, Chardon, Cordes, Couillandeu, Davison, DeLiesseline, DuBose, Elliott, Evance, Gale, Gendron, Gourdin, Guignard, Hallowell, Hyrne, Jameson, LeGrand, McCrea, McDowell, Molineux, Morecock, Pasquereau, Phillips, Poinsett, Reid, Richardson, Sarrazin, Schencking[h], Simons, Smith, Stitt, Varin, Williamson, Withers, and related lines. Materials include research notes (mostly typewritten); clippings; photographs of family members; photographs of family portraits, coats-of-arms, family homes, gravestones, and other subjects; related correspondence with Mary B. Linfield (New Orleans, La.), Edward Richardson (Florida), and others (ca. 1910-1964); maps and plats; printed material; transcriptions and photostats of William Richardson's letters (bulk 1770s); and a few original family documents, including a Cordes family mortgage (1855) on a slave woman named Satira and her child Moses.

Also included are clippings (1958) concerning Emma B. Richardson and congratulatory letters and notes (1958) to her on the occasion of her retirement. There is also a typewritten transcription of Capt. James Bentham's order book (1778-1780) which includes muster rolls, orders, and reports of the Charleston (S.C.) militia regiment.

Charleston writer, genealogist. Typescripts, notes, clippings, photos of people and places, correspondence, charts, and other material regarding allied families of EM. Families include Benthon with typescript of regimental book of Capt. James Benthon (1778-1780, see SCHM vol. 53-54). Benthon-Simons, Walker and Hardy families; Boylston family, Bruneau, Buchanan, Buford, Cartwright, Chardon, Cordes (see Anthony Cordes and his Descendents SCHM vol. 43); Couillandean, Davidson, DeLiesseline, DuBose, Elliot, Eance, Gale-Philips family, Gendron, Gourdin, Guignard, Hallowell, Hyrne, Jameson, LeGrand, McCrea, McDowell, Molineaux, Morecock, Pasquereau, Poinsett-Moncrief families, Reid, much on the Richardson family including typescript and copies of mostly Revolutionary War correspondence (1765-1784) of William Richardson (see SCHM index); Sarrazin, Schenckinck, Smith, Stitt, Varin, Williamson, Withers and misc. notes. Families from Charleston, Mt. Pleasant, McClellanville, other Lowcountry locations, Boston, MA and LA. Alphabetically arranged.
