

Matthew Family Papers SCHS# 0684.00

Scope and content: Collection contains papers of or relating to several related families, principally those of Matthew, Peronneau, Mathewes, Kahrs, and McGowan. Included are papers of Rosalie Olivecrona (Olive) McGowan Matthew and William McGowan Matthew, as well as papers relating to Clelia Peronneau Mathewes McGowan, William Campbell McGowan, John Douglas Matthew, Kathryn Kahrs Matthew, George Frederick Matthew of New Brunswick (Canada), and William Diller Matthew. The collection includes some family documents as well as extensive genealogical information on the principal families as well as the related families of Coffin, Larisey, Besselieu, and Diller. Papers relating to Rosalie Olivecrona (Olive) McGowan Matthew include birth certificates, an obituary, recipes, and a newspaper article (1982) about her relationship with the family of Rosalie Roos Olivecrona of Sweden. There are also papers relating to John Raven Mathewes and his plantation, Bear Island, and the military service of his grandson John Raven Mathewes.

Photographs, which have been removed to the Visual Material Collection (0684 VM), include images of John Raven Matthewes (1788-1867), Anna Peronneau Parker Gordon (1850-1936), and Clelia Peronneau Matthewes McGowan. Also included are photographs of George Frederick Matthew of Canada, and his family. There are numerous photographs relating to John Douglas and Olive Matthew, as well as William McGowan Matthew and Kathryn Kahrs Matthew and their daughter Kit. One group of cartes de visite which were removed from an album includes images of William Peronneau (1768-1848), Eliza Peronneau Matthewes (1835-1923), and John Raven Matthewes (1832-1892?). Other items include silhouettes (on greeting cards) by John Bennett.

Biographical/Historical note: George Frederick Matthew (1837-1923) was a noted Canadian scientist. His son, John Douglas Matthew (1885-1931) married Rosalie Olivecrona (Olive) McGowan of South Carolina, and they lived in Charleston. Olive Matthew was the daughter of Clelia Peronneau Matthewes McGowan (1865-1956) and William Campbell McGowan (1858-1998) of Abbeville, S.C., and she was the granddaughter of William Raven Mathewes (1829-1905) and Eliza Peronneau Mathewes (1825-1923) of South Carolina. William McGowan Matthew (1926-2015), the son of John and Olive Matthew, married Kathryn Kahrs (1929-2014), and their daughter Kathryn (Kit) Kahrs Matthew married Dr. George Stevens of Charleston.
