

McLaughlin Family Papers, 1925-2020 SCHS# 0685.00

Biographical/Historical Note: Iris Ladson McLaughlin (1915-2007) was born in Sumter, S.C. She was the daughter of Richard James Ladson and Rosa Pack Ladson, and she graduated from Lincoln High School and Morris College in Sumter. She taught in public schools for many years and later became involved in creating a preschool program, becoming its supervisor, and retiring in 1977. She was a member of many community and national organizations, and was an active member of First Baptist Missionary Church and several related religious organizations. Her husband, Arthur Spiegel McLaughlin (1912-1996), the son of Bogin McLaughlin and Rosa Parker McLaughlin, was a native of Virginia. His family moved to Sumter, where he graduated from Lincoln High School and Morris College. He was an educator for some years before beginning a longtime career in the U.S. postal service in 1942. Like his wife, he was active in many community organizations and at First Baptist Missionary Church. Iris and Arthur McLaughlin had two children, Dr. David McLaughlin (1934-1989), who became a professor of zoology at Howard University, and Dr. Arthuree Rosemille McLaughlin Wright, a librarian, educator, and minister.

Scope and content: Papers of the McLaughlin family of Sumter, South Carolina, include personal papers of Iris Ladson McLaughlin, Arthur S. McLaughlin, David McLaughlin, and Arthuree R. McLaughlin Wright. Papers of Iris L. McLaughlin include her master's thesis, 1955; school and employment records; papers relating to her membership in the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, the Sumter County Democratic Party, the Red Hat Society, the One More Effort Club, the National Association of Colored Women's Clubs, Church Women United, and other organizations; papers relating to her involvement in First Baptist Missionary Church and the Wateree Baptist Association, Lower Division; her professional papers pertaining to her career as a teacher and as director of the Sumter preschool program; and records pertaining to Moore Elementary School, Lincoln High School, and Morris College. Also of note in her papers is a record book (1925-1940s) of the Shiloh Baptist Church (later First Baptist) containing minutes, financial records, and lists of members. Papers of Arthur S. McLaughlin include papers reflecting his involvement in the postal service, the Goodfellows Club, the Masons, and the Walker Cemetery Association. Papers of David McLaughlin include correspondence, school records, his dissertation (1965); and papers relating to his doctorate degree as well as posthumous awards and scholarships in his name. Papers of Arthuree R. McLaughlin Wright include memorabilia, writings, ordination records, and papers pertaining to her son Joshua K.

Wright. There are also papers pertaining to the related families of Ladson and Frances Bethea Grant and her family.

Collection also consists of photographs removed from the McLaughlin Family Papers (0685). They include images of students at the Penn School, Moore Elementary School and other elementary schools, and Lincoln High School; photographs relating to North Carolina Central University and Frances Bethea Grant; images of members of the McLaughlin, Ladson, and Wright families; photographs relating to First Baptist Missionary Church in Sumter; and photograph albums kept by David McLaughlin including images of him and his family.
