Biographical/Historical Note: Robert B. Cuthbert, a native of Summerville, S.C., was a staff member of the U.S. Vegetable Laboratory in Charleston for more than forty years. He was the editor of *Flat Rock of the Old Time*, and the co-editor of *Northern Money, Southern Land*. He was a member of the South Carolina Historical Society, and spent many years researching Lowcountry planter families, their plantations, and their connections with Flat Rock, N.C. He passed away on December 17, 2021.

Scope and content: This collection chiefly consists of Robert B. Cuthbert's research for his two books, *Flat Rock of the Old Time* and *Northern Money, Southern Land*. It also includes his research on other topics as well as related photographs. Flat Rock material consists of notes on Langdon Cheves (1848-1939) and his family, the families of Middleton, Rutledge, and Pinckney, Heyward, and other families and individuals including Captain Thomas Pinckney, Mitchell King (1783-1852), and the Count de Choiseul; photocopies and transcriptions of correspondence of Langdon Cheves, his mother Isabella Cheves, members of the Henry A. Middleton family, and others; and notes and research on properties in Flat Rock, the French Broad River area, and other nearby locations in North Carolina; as well as letters and other papers relating to the publication of the book *Flat Rock of the Old Time*. Material pertaining to the book *Northern Money, Southern Land* consists of research on numerous plantations in Beaufort, Hampton, Jasper, and other South Carolina counties, as well as notes on the Heyward family and other planter families of those areas, and the landscape architect Robert Marvin. There is also research material, including notes and clippings, concerning agriculture in South Carolina, African American culture, and the artists William Halsey, Corrie McCallum, David Halsey, Louise Halsey, and Nancy Gray.

The first ten boxes of this collection were processed in 2020, and an accrual (boxes 11-20) was added in 2022. The accrual also contains Cuthbert's research for his two published books, as well as research for a book he planned to write about Summerville, S.C. Also included in the accrual are some personal papers such as correspondence, and papers reflecting Cuthbert's interest in art and other topics. Two oversize folders (located in the flat files) chiefly contain maps and plats pertaining to research on South Carolina plantations (for the book *Northern Money, Southern Land*), and maps and plats pertaining to the Flat Rock area in North Carolina.
