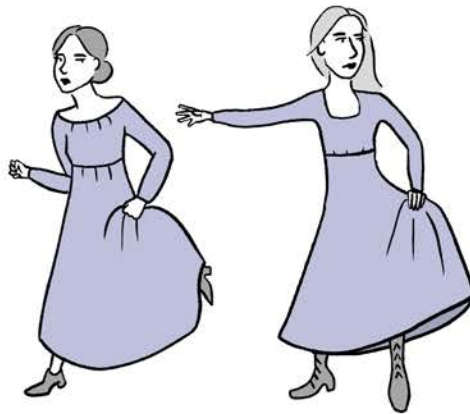




"What a world of vicissitudes is this!

Follow the instructions on the following page to create a toy similar to the one Eliza described in her letter, that tells the story of her encounters with American and British soldiers.

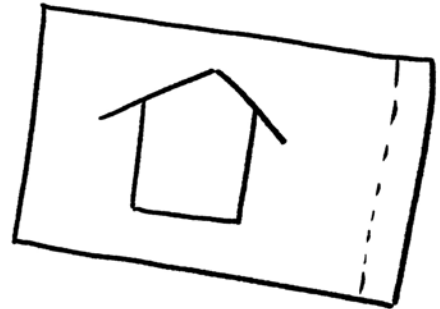
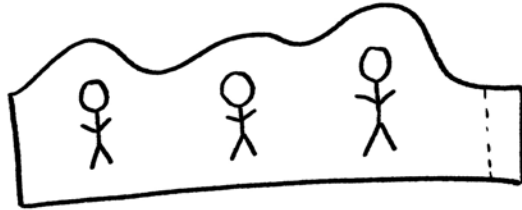

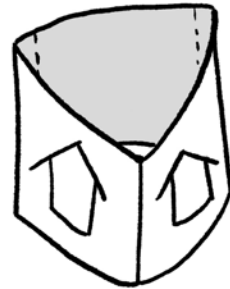

1: cut out the landscape and character pieces



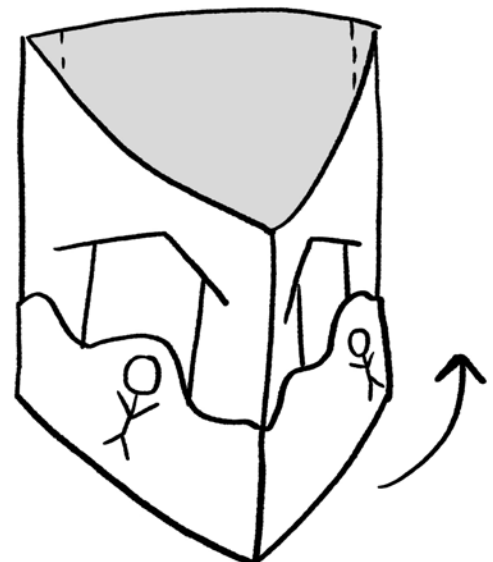
2: tape or glue the pieces into rings



3: slide the character ring onto the landscape ring



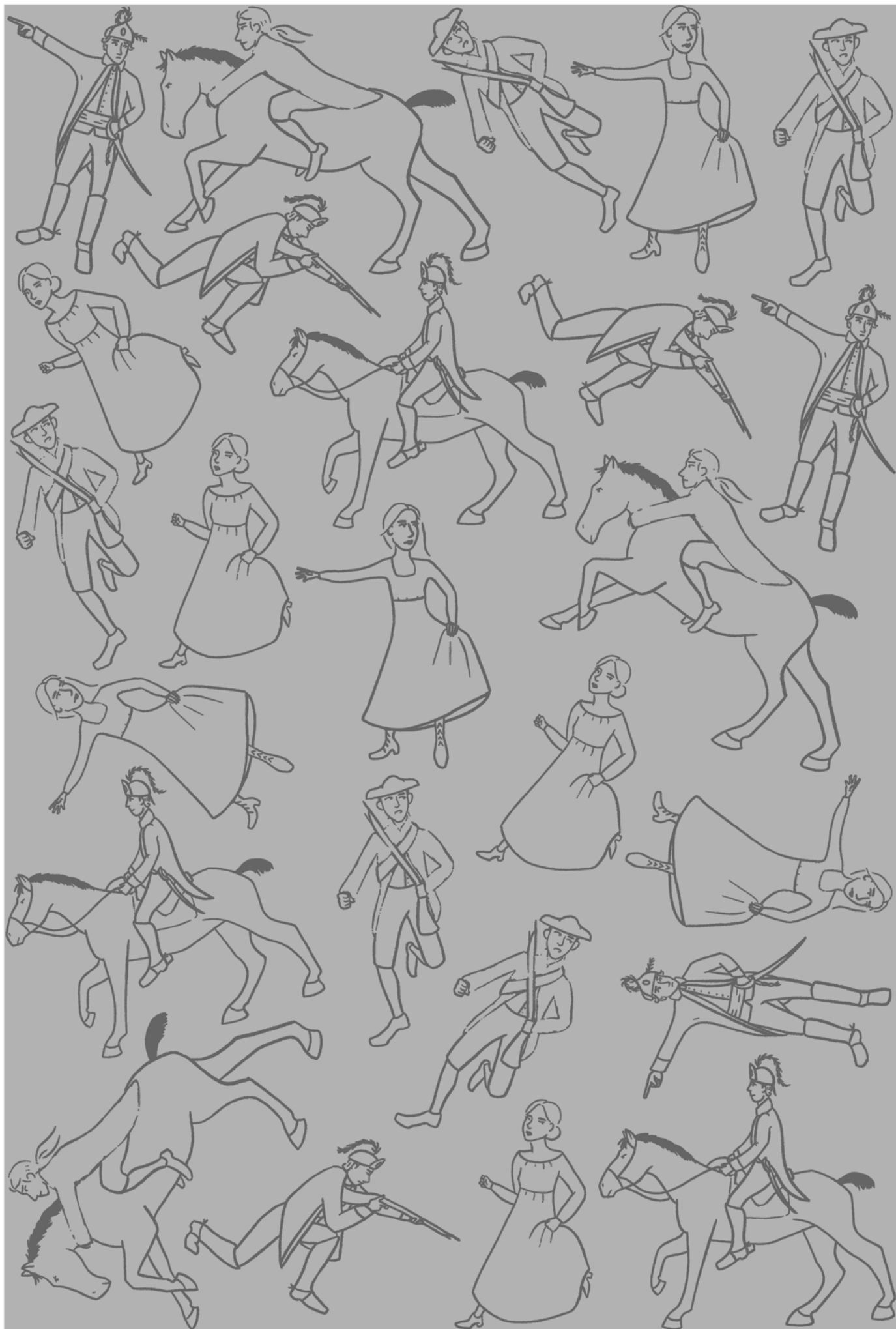
4: rotate the rings to view different character and landscape combinations

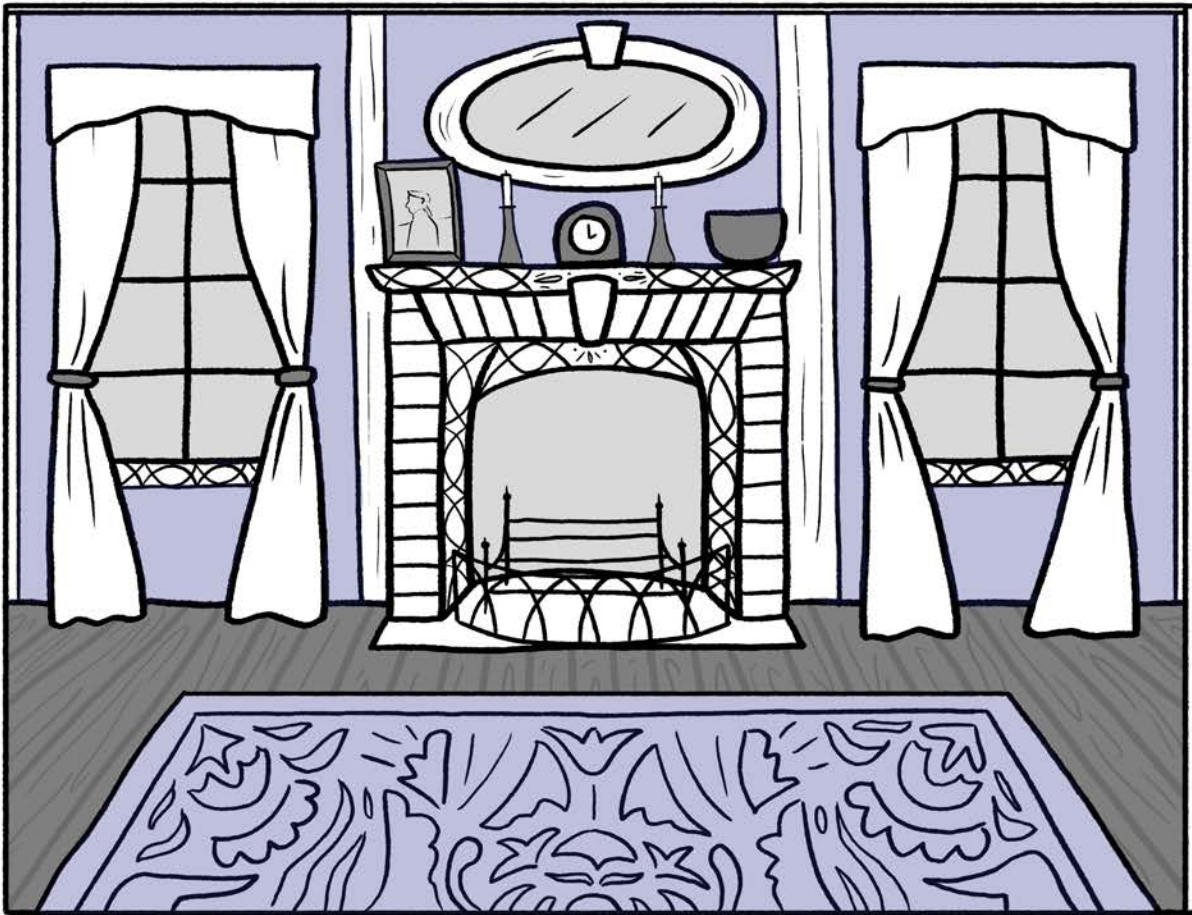

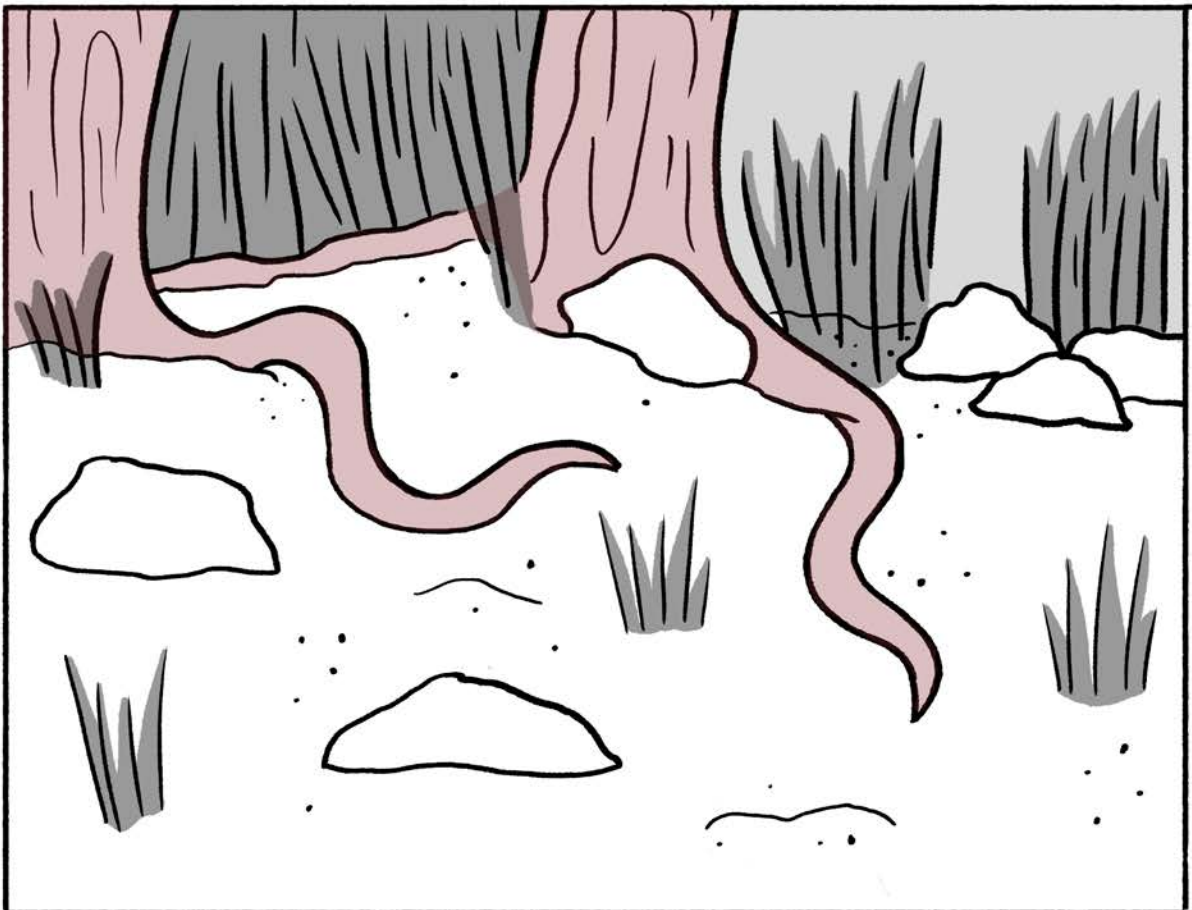

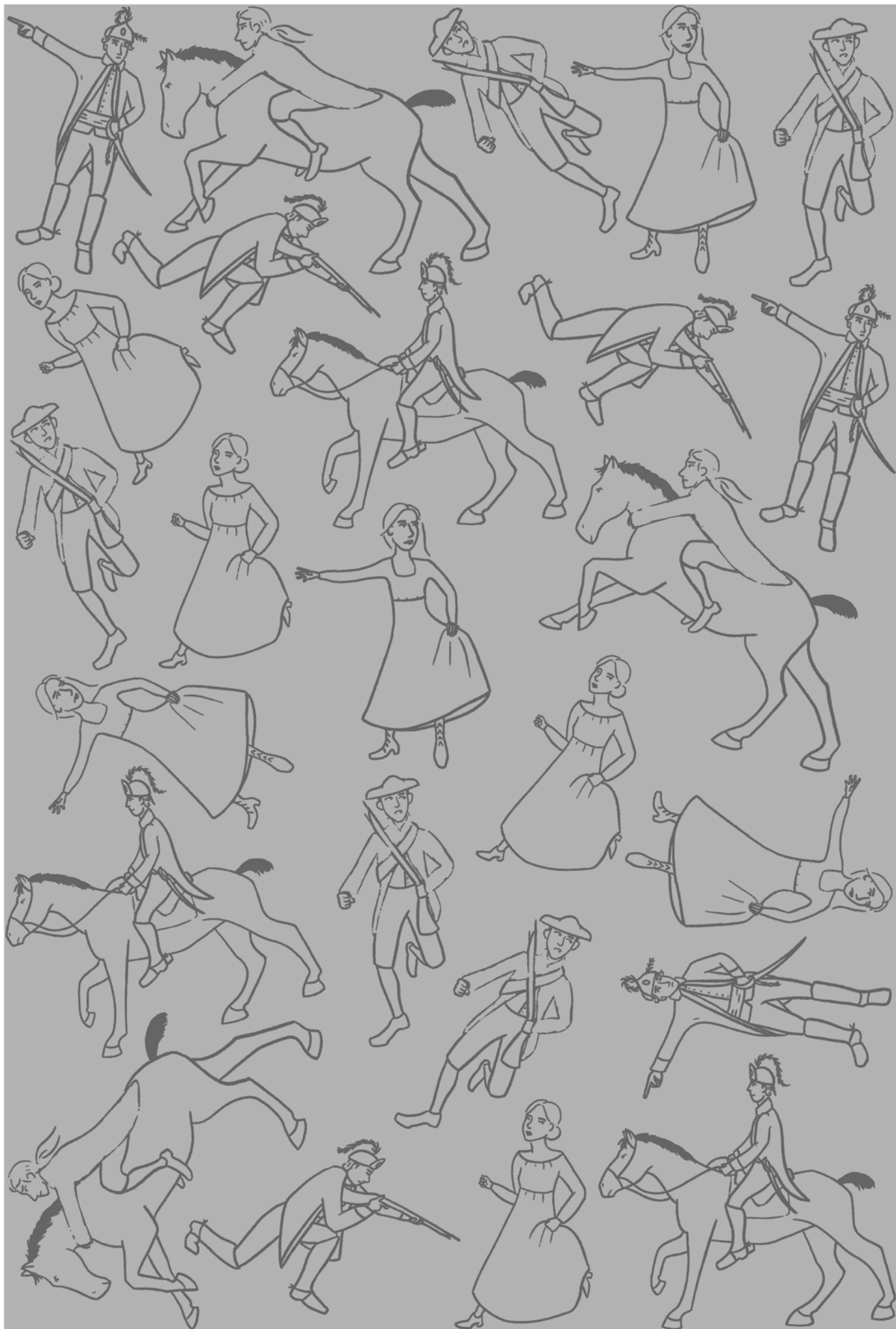
