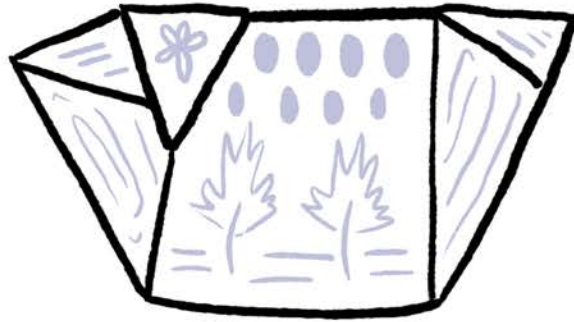




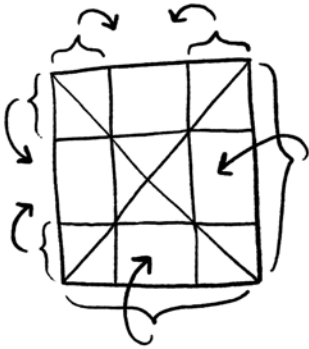
Catawba Pottery is well known for its craftsmanship and quality. The Catawba frequently traded pottery in the 1700s for European and American goods like textiles, firearms, and tools.

The Catawba decorate their pottery by pressing plants or their fingers against wet clay to leave indentations. Animals and nature motifs are common in Catawba artwork.

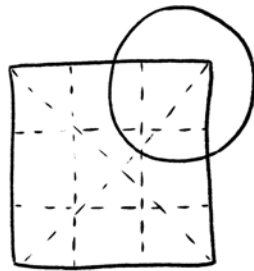
Decorate and fold your own paper bowl. Use an ink pad to make designs with fingerprints, leaves, and flowers. Use crayon rubbing to create textures from tree bark and other surfaces.

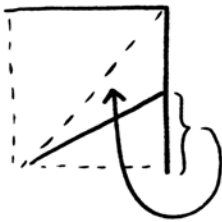
Once your paper is decorated, it is ready to be folded into a bowl:



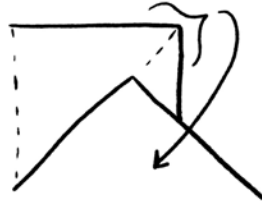
1: fold the paper along the lines to create creases, diagonally and into thirds



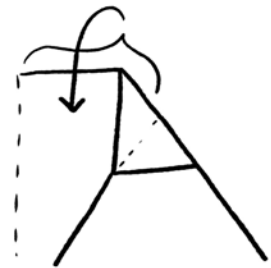
2: flip over your paper, and begin working in one corner



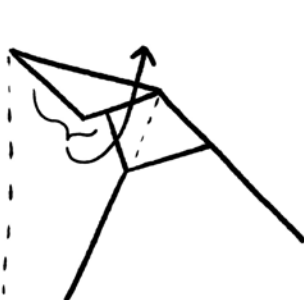
3: fold the edge of the paper up to the diagonal crease



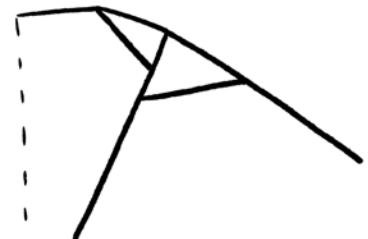
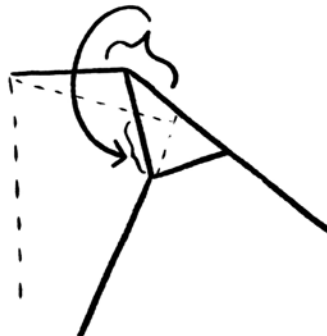
4: fold the corner down



5: fold the top corner down

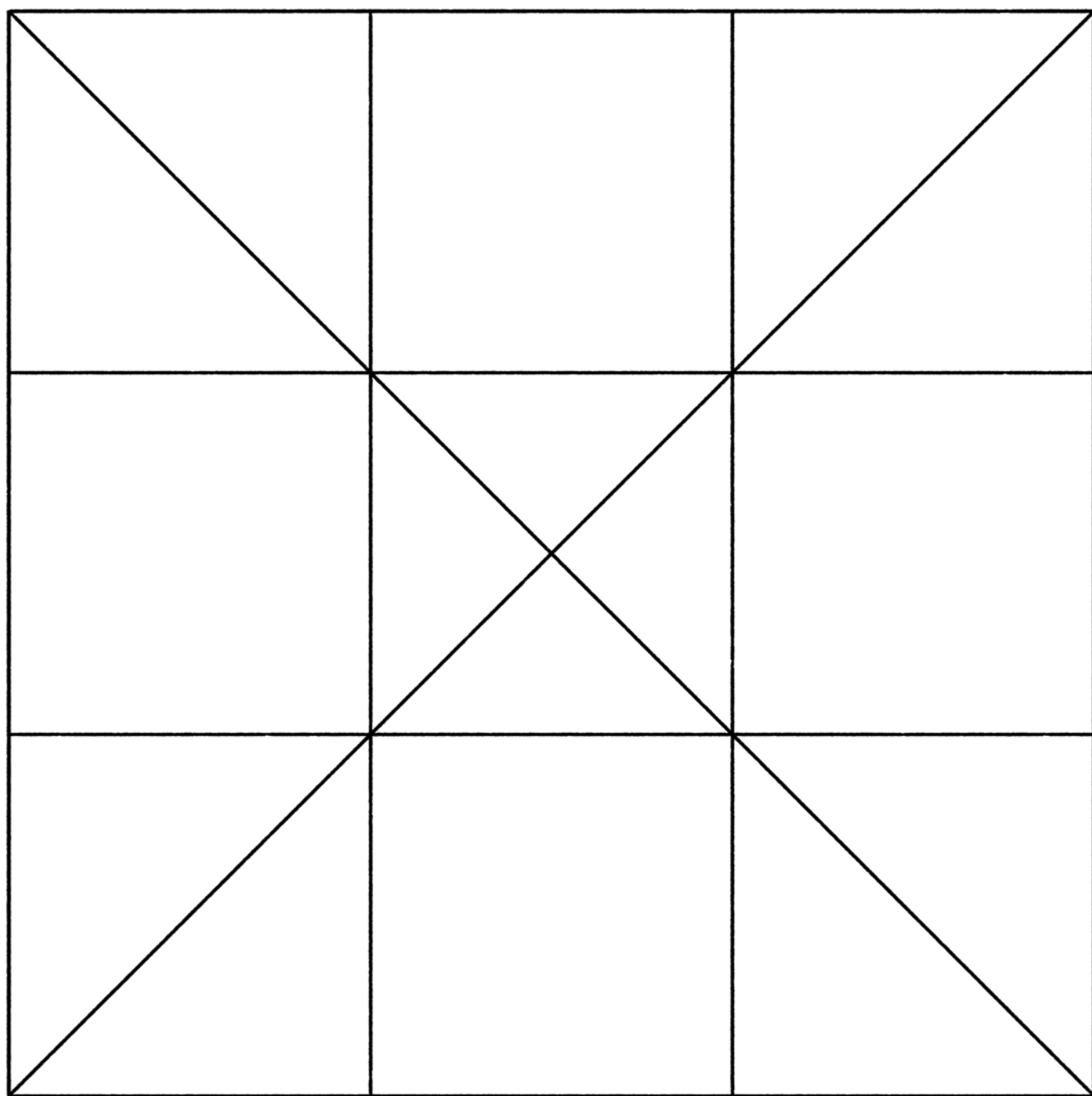


6: unfold the top corner and use the crease to tuck the corner under the flap formed by the edge of the paper



7: with the corner secured, repeat steps 3-6 for each corner to form a bowl
